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PRESIDENT'S CORNER CONSTRUCTION ZONE ROTONDA

It is spring and that means the start of construction season everywhere, but this year it will include major work here at The Rotonda. To maintain our 45-year-old home, we need to keep up a regular program of repair and replacement of key parts of our infrastructure. This year, 2024, the construction work throughout the complex will be more noticeable, and unfortunately more annoying, but we must do it.



Some of the projects are already completed since the first of the year. The new hot water boilers in Buildings 3 and 5 are installed and up and running. This project started late last year, but there were associated outages early this year and we finished it in February. Also, new playground equipment has been installed and was cleared for play on March 18.

New sliding glass doors are currently on order for Building 1. We expect installation to begin in May or June. The Façade project for Building 2 has already begun and residents can expect noise and dust through at least the spring, summer, and early fall. In April, we expect work to begin on the demolition of the existing gate houses. This will be the first step in replacing the Greensboro Drive gatehouse and refurbishing the International Drive gatehouse. This project will also include the construction of two new pedestrian gates, one near each gatehouse.

The Board has approved the contract for the replacement of the canopies in front of all five residential buildings, and we expect work to begin sometime in late spring. The garage restoration project, which begins on Building 4 this year, is awaiting permits from Fairfax County before it can start. This project will be a major inconvenience for residents as vehicles in both garage levels in Building 4 will have to be emptied for much of the construction period, affecting parking throughout the complex. More information on both projects will be available to residents as the contracts are nearing the implementation phase.

Other projects in the mill include a new phone system for the front office, new front doors for all buildings, replacement roof exhaust fans, restoration of select trees around the perimeter, and additional electric vehicle charging systems, if we can solve the power requirements dilemma.

As you can see, life at the Rotonda is going to be hectic throughout the warm weather construction period, and we ask for everyone's patience and understanding as all this work is important and necessary. Most of these projects have been in the planning stages for several years and we have carefully orchestrated their funding and timing to get them done, keep them out of conflict with each other, and minimize their effects on our residents.

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
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ROTONDA PROJECTS ON THE MAP




A MOTHER'S DAY TRIBUTE

BURST-PROOF HOSES & DRYER VENT DUCTS

The By-Laws of the Association Section 8,(a),(2) reads in part, "Nothing shall be done or kept in any Unit or in the Common Elements, which will increase the rate of insurance for the Property or any part thereof applicable for residential use without the prior written consent of the Board of Directors. No Unit Owner shall permit anything to be done or kept in his Unit or in the Common Elements which will result in the cancellation of insurance on the Property or any part thereof or which would be in violation of any law, regulation or administrative ruling..."

In July 2014, the Association's insurance carrier notified the Association of certain required plumbing changes that must be made to every unit. The Board of Directors then incorporated this change into Policy Resolution #8. Now, residents are required to install guaranteed burst-proof hoses or water supply pipes for all plumbing appliances. This change applies to dish washers, clothes washers, ice-maker water lines, faucets, toilets, and other plumbing appliances that require a water supply. In addition, the Association recommends, but does not require, that a drip pan be installed under clothes washers.



Burst-proof Hoses: The use of burst-proof hoses is critical in preventing floods that cause expensive insurance claims. Fortunately for Rotonda, our insurance deductible remains at \$10K because of our residents that do comply with these types of policy updates. But not the case of all condos, there's a condominium (unnamed) nearby that has a \$200K water damage deductible because of excessive floods and water damage claims.

Dryer Vent Hoses: Local requirements for dryer vent hoses are in detail in the Virginia Residential Code which adopts the amendments of the International Residential Code (IRC). As it applies for The Rotonda, residents should be using an exhaust duct that has a smooth interior finish and shall be constructed of metal material. Flexible or non-flexible metal duct is what's safe, not solely plastic or vinyl. When making connections from your dryer to the main dryer duct shaft, use a 4" duct, and make the connections by use of fireproof foil tape. DO NOT USE screws will penetrate the interior of the dryer vent duct which allows lint to build-up on the screw and cause a fire hazard. DO NOT USE those cheap plastic or vinyl dryer vent hoses without having an interior metallic liner.

Need Help? Owners may elect to change out their water supply lines or vent hoses themselves, via a contractor, or through the Rotonda's IUS Program. Occasionally, contractors may take shortcuts, so when installing replacement washers, dishwashers, refrigerators, or other plumbing appliances, ensure your contractor uses burst-proof hoses.

Owners of units whose supply lines are <u>not in</u> <u>compliance</u> may jeopardize an insurance claim if they were to have a leak caused by use of non-burst-proof water supply lines.

Please inspect your unit, if you are using the cheap plastic water supply lines and need new burst-proof hoses installed, we encourage you to utilize the Rotonda's In-Unit Service Program. For service, please call David Smith, Maintenance Coordinator at 703-821-0100, Ext 711.



Did you know that all exterior lighting fixtures at the Rotonda have been upgraded to energy-efficient LED technology? This transition was made in line with our commitment to improving safety and sustainability and reducing our environmental impact. LED lights not only consume less energy but also boast a longer lifespan, contributing to cost savings and enhancing the overall safety and aesthetics of our community.

The exterior LED lights at the Rotonda are equipped with advanced photocell sensors that automatically detect changes in ambient light levels and adjust the illumination accordingly. As a result, the lights seamlessly turn on at dusk and switch off at dawn, providing consistent and reliable lighting throughout the property while minimizing unnecessary energy usage.

TRASH & RECYCLING RULES & REMINDERS

We want to remind everyone of the importance of properly disposing of trash and recycling within our community. Keeping our living spaces clean and odorfree benefits us all. Here are some important guidelines to follow:

Trash Disposal: Each of our five high-rise buildings is equipped with a trash room conveniently located in the Service Lobby by the Service Elevator on every floor. The majority of your trash can be disposed of in


these rooms. Remember, all trash must be bagged and placed into the trash chute located on the wall. Simply pull the handle to open the chute, drop your bag of trash, and close the chute door. Please refrain from leaving loose trash anywhere in the room. This helps to maintain cleanliness and prevents unpleasant odors.



Recycling: Inside each trash room, you'll find a single-stream recycling system. All recyclables can be placed in the same bin. This includes mixed paper, flattened cardboard, plastic bottles and jugs, and metal food and beverage containers. Please discard all glass in the purple recycling bin. Before disposing of these items, ensure they are rinsed.

Trash Cans in Commons Areas: Trash cans are conveniently placed throughout the Community Center, mail rooms, activity rooms, and outside in various locations. Please make use of these bins for proper disposal.

We appreciate your cooperation in maintaining a clean and pleasant environment for all residents. Let's work together to keep Rotonda beautiful inside and out. Refer to the Trash & Recycling brochure for a list of all rules and reminders, available in Building Link and at the front desk.





BALCONY RULES AND REMINDERS OPEN AND ENCLOSED BALCONIES

As we enjoy the perks of having balconies and terraces in our residences, it's crucial to ensure that these spaces are utilized responsibly and in adherence to the rules and regulations set forth by Rotonda management and Fairfax County. Whether you have an enclosed balcony or an open one, certain guidelines must be followed to maintain safety, cleanliness, and harmony within our community.

Enclosed Balconies/Terraces: For those with enclosed balconies, please keep in mind the following regulations:

- No Open Flames: Activities such as cooking, grilling, or any use of open flames are strictly prohibited due to safety concerns.
- 2. <u>Preservation of Decor:</u> Your decor should not impact the brick structure. While holes may be drilled in the mortar, activities that damage the brick are not permitted.
- 3. <u>Approved Modifications:</u> Any modifications, including painting or flooring installation, must be approved by management before implementation.

Open Balconies/Terraces: If you have an open balcony, please adhere to these guidelines:



- 1. <u>Permitted Items:</u> Floor planters, small appliances, and flags, are allowed without prior approval.
- 2. <u>Supervision of Children and</u>
 <u>Pets:</u> Ensure that children and pets are accompanied and supervised while on open balconies to prevent accidents and maintain safety. Pets must never be
- left unattended on open balconies.
- Responsible Decor: Avoid activities that could cause damage or create a nuisance, such as dropping or throwing items from the balcony.
- Water Usage: Refrain from watering plants in a manner that causes dripping onto balconies below, as this can lead to inconvenience and potential damage.
- Limitations on Decorative Changes: Painting or installing floor coverings other than porcelain-type tile is prohibited to maintain uniformity and cleanliness and to prevent moisture damage to the concrete floor surfaces.

Items NOT Permitted on Open Balconies/Terraces:

In addition to the regulations outlined earlier, please note the following items that are not permitted on open balconies:

- Bird feeders or statuary
- Aerials or antennas (except as allowed and approved by Management)
- Clothing for airing or drying
- Items or furnishings, such as umbrellas, that may be pushed or blown off
- Bicycles and other recreational equipment
- Large children's toys (tricycles, wagons, portable swimming pools, etc.)
- · Screens, blinds, shutters, and enclosures
- Cooking, grilling, heating, or any open flame
- Major appliances or other mechanical devices or equipment
- Hangers installed in the slab above
- Storage containers
- Awnings
- Paint cans or other unsightly debris
- Tires
- Wind chimes

Being a Considerate Neighbor:

In addition to following these rules, it's essential to be considerate of our neighbors. By respecting these guidelines, we contribute to a pleasant living environment for everyone in our community.

Let's work together to ensure that our balconies and terraces remain safe, enjoyable, and in compliance with the regulations outlined by our community management. Thank you for your cooperation and commitment to maintaining the quality of our living spaces.















