

# PRESIDENT'S CORNER WHAT DO YOU KNOW ABOUT THE ROTONDA?



The Rotonda was built in 1979-1980 and is situated on Gantt Hill, which at 512 feet elevation is one of the highest points in Fairfax County. Giuseppe Cecchi was the developer who built the Rotonda, along with many other Washington area projects. Other notable achievements of Cecchi include the Watergate and the Rotonda's two sister communities, Watergate at Landmark in Maryland and Montebello in McLean. The Rotonda's Italian Renaissance architectural theme reflects Mr. Cecchi's Italian heritage.

The Rotonda has 1,168 condominiums in the five 10-story high rise buildings and the 3-unit original sample models building. The community incorporates 34 acres of grounds, including land-scaped gardens, a wooded area with picnic and playground facilities, walking and fitness trails, and two ponds. There are also tennis, pickle ball, volley ball and basketball courts. For the children living here there are a mini soccer field, a tricycle and scooter riding court, outdoor play equipment, and an indoor play area.

Elsewhere on the property there is a golf putting green, indoor and outdoor pools, hot and whirlpool baths, a world-class Fitness Center, and a smaller Fitness Center Annex in Building 3. The Community Center also has facilities for regular and chair yoga; a multipurpose room that supports an indoor children's play area; table games including ping pong, pool, air hockey and foosball; a free book library; a Wi-Fi supported reading and study area; and Women's and Men's spas for showering and changing.


There are approximately 3,200 residents living here and about 700 of them are children. The Rotonda is truly an international community with families moving here from around the world. At last count, residents here speak some 18 different languages and for many of these folks English is not a first or even a second language. Some of our international residents are diplomatic staff or represent foreign businesses. Others come for the excellent local public schools or for the lovely grounds, or the security of a fenced and gated facility with a 24 hours/day Patrol and Access control staff.

The 1982 Movie, "Best Friends," starring Burt Reynolds and Goldie Hawn was filmed here at the Rotonda and in the 1980's TV journalist and news host Sam Donaldson lived here. The Rotonda is also home for senior business and government executives and staff. We are also proud of the number of teachers who call this home and find time and energy to help with our children's programs after long days at their real job.

Many of our residents have volunteered to help out the community by supporting the eleven committees the Board has established to help make life more enjoyable. This year we have some 100 people contributing to our committees. If you haven't attended some of the Social or Children's Committee events, you are really missing out on some great fun and opportunities to get to know your neighbors.

## **TYSONS CASINO - SUMMER UPDATE**

### **ARTICLE BY ROTONDA AD HOC CASINO COMMITTEE CHAIR PAULA MARTINO**

As you are probably aware, the 2025 casino bill was defeated in Richmond thanks to the grassroots efforts by citizens and groups in the Greater Tysons Region, including Rotonda residents. Unfortunately, another bill is expected to be introduced in the 2026 session the details of which may not be known until late fall/winter. This does not mean the Tysons casino is not "an issue" right now. Here are some related updates and news items to bring you up to speed:

- In the Lieutenant Governor Democratic Primaries, which took place on June 17th the candidate Dr. Babur Lateef made his stance against a casino in Tysons well-known. His wins in key precincts along the Rt. 123 and Rt. 7 corridors, including the Rotonda, shows how much Greater Tysons residents appreciate his efforts to stand up for the people who would be most affected by this project.
- On June 28th, the Democratic and Republican primaries for the 11th Congressional District were held. James Walkinshaw, who currently represents the Braddock district on the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors, won the Democratic nomination by a very large margin for the seat vacated by the death of Congressman Gerry Connolly. On Walkinshaw's campaign website, he stated this position on the Tysons casino: "I've been clear from the first time it was proposed: a casino in Fairfax County just doesn't make sense."
- On the Republican side, Stewart Whitson secured the Republican nomination for the 11th Congressional District. Whitson is a U.S. Army veteran and former FBI Special Agent and currently works at a conservative think tank. Whitson's position on a Tysons casino is unclear and he has yet to comment on the proposal publicly.

In May, Ad Hoc Casino Committee members Marlene Olarte, Paula Martino and Rena Seaholm attended the Spring Social hosted by Fairfax County Board of Supervisors Chairman Jeff McKay. This free, public event gave us a unique opportunity to have several informal conversations with County Supervisors about the Rotonda community's continued opposition to a Tysons casino. Here we are pictured with Chairman McKay.

At the time of this writing, our Board Supervisor Dalia Palchik has not changed her position on casino legislation that targets Tysons. She does not oppose being given the authority to hold a referendum on a casino.


essays or timeless classics, members are invited to connect through stories that spark curiosity, empathy, and lively conversation.





## **AVOID MAIL ROOM CLUTTER HERE'S WHAT YOU CAN DO!**

We've seen an increase in Amazon packages being left in the mail room, blocking access and creating tripping hazards. Management has met with Amazon representatives and updated our delivery rules in their system—but the issue continues. Their advice? Complaints are most effective when they come directly from customers.

Here's how you can help:

- 1. Log into your Amazon Profile
- 2. Under **Delivery Instructions**, write: "Please deliver to my front door. Do not leave in the mail room."

If you've done this and still find your packages being delivered to the mailroom, call Amazon at 844-370-7615 to report missed front-door deliveries.

In addition to updating your Amazon preferences, here are a few other ways everyone can help keep the mail room accessible and safe:

- Pick up packages promptly—especially over weekends and holidays when volume increases
  - · Break down and recycle boxes in the designated recycling area instead of leaving them behind.
  - Use secure package lockers or Amazon Hub when possible for higher-value items.

We'll continue working with Amazon and other carriers to advocate for safe, efficient de-

# DON'T FLUSH WET WIPES, EVEN "FLUSHABLE" ONES

As convenient as wet wipes can be—whether for cleaning, personal hygiene, or disinfecting please remember: wet wipes should never be flushed down the toilet, even if the packaging claims they are "flushable."

While it may seem harmless, flushing wet wipes causes serious damage to plumbing systems—both in your unit and throughout the entire Rotonda community.

#### Why "Flushable" Doesn't Mean Safe for **Pipes**

According to municipal wastewater authorities and plumbing professionals, most so-called "flushable" wipes don't break down like toilet paper does. Instead, they remain largely intact as they travel through the sewer system. Over a short time, wipes will:

- Clog pipes and building sewer lines, leading to messy, expensive backups.
- Contribute to fatbergs, which are massive blockages made of wipes, grease, and other debris.
- Damage pumps and treatment equipment at wastewater facilities, increasing maintenance costs and environmental risk.

The Rotonda has experienced an uptick in plumbing problems due to improper disposal of wipes and other non-flushable items. These issues can and will cause backups that affect multiple tiers, or even the entire lower-level of a building. This issue leads to very costly repairs, and can even temporarily shut down of water supply for the entire building until the issue is resolved. When a 10" sewer main is clogged with wipes, it's a serious problem.

Residents need to pay special attention to other key factors that are clogging the sewer mains, the following items should never be put down the toilet or drain:

- Flushable wipes, frequently used by Care Providers (primary problem item). Photo: Wipes clogging a pipe at The Rotonda
- Egg shells, celery, rice, potato peels, corn husks, coffee grounds.
- Grease and cooking oils; do not pour down the sink, let it solidify then dispose of trash.
- Paint, drywall compounds, chemicals.

Let's work together to keep our community plumbing system running smoothly. A good rule of thumb: If it's not toilet paper, don't flush it.






## RESERVE PROJECTS AROUND THE PROPERTY

### **UPDATES FROM THE FACILITIES MANAGER**

Residents may have noticed significant progress across the property this summer as major reserve projects continue to advance. Here's a roundup of where things stand as of mid-July:



#### **Building 1 Front Entrance Canopy**

The dramatic glass installation is now complete, with each of the nine large panels carefully lifted into place using an electronic suction device. The shaded glass not only enhances the visual appeal of the canopy but also helps block intense sun rays. Stainless steel drainage grates have been installed on both sides, although some adjustments are needed to prevent them from flipping when stepped on. Lighting is now visible at night, although minor adjustments need to be made. The next Building to be worked on is Building 5, where work is scheduled to start in early August.

#### **Building 4 Sliding Door Replacements**

This project is 99% complete, with only three sliding doors remaining to be installed. These will be addressed once the associated unit owners return from overseas, with



Aeroseal expected to complete the final installations by the end of July.

#### **Greensboro Pedestrian Gate**

There are no changes since the last report. The project remains paused as the team awaits revised pricing for stronger and more accessible modifications to the gate, fencing, and security components.

#### **International Gatehouse**

Demolition is delayed due to complications with rerouting the main power line, currently encased in a concrete box four feet underground. Careful excavation is underway to avoid damaging the main feed, which would be extremely costly to replace. Inside the gatehouse, demolition has yet to begin. We expect this project to be back on track in early August.

#### **Building 2 Garage** Renovation

Workers have begun removing the old waterproofing in strips and identifying areas that require repair, which are more numerous than in other garages. The garage is well ventilated with large exhaust hoses, and markings indicate areas slated for patching.



A future project will be needed to address extensive rusting in the ceiling's embedded lighting conduits.



#### **Building 3 Façade Project**

This project is on schedule. Crews have shifted work to the rear of Building 3. The back lane is closed during working hours while façade repairs continue.

#### **Sport Courts Restoration**

Crews are repairing low spots and rebuilding sunken areas of the court. Unfortunately, progress was briefly disrupted when paint was thrown on the basketball court after hours. Restoration continues,

with careful surface leveling required throughout.

#### **Community Center Reorganization**

Following resident and committee feedback:

- Two large mirrors replaced the yoga room's glass doors.
- The juice bar was removed and briefly replaced with a foosball table, although both it and the ping-pong table have since been returned to their original spots by resident action.
- An air hockey table was moved into the small video room, with new power lines run for its operation.
- Dead weights are still pending relocation.



#### **Electrical Preventative Maintenance**

Once Dominion Energy confirms the planned outages, Mona Electrical will begin work. Initial efforts will focus on building infrastructure, followed later by meter circuit breaker replacements in Buildings 3, 4, and 5.

#### **Security Access System Upgrades**

The Board of Directors approved the bid by Condortech (CTS) for Security & Access Control System Replacement at the July 22 Board Meeting. Refer to the Board Packet available on Building Link for more information on what to expect. Stay tuned for more information in future updates.



This is especially important at the entrance gates, traffic circles, and areas with limited visibility. Always come to a complete stop when someone is crossing

## **CLASSIFIED AD GUIDELINES**

The Rotonda community bulletin boards both in person and online through Rotonda Home Link—are a great way for residents to share announcements, sell gently used items, or find a pet sitter or tutor. But to keep things running smoothly and fairly for everyone, please be mindful of a few important guidelines.

- Keep It Short and Sweet: While you're allowed up to 3,000 characters, we encourage keeping your ad between 500-1,000 characters to be courteous of how much space it takes up on the physical bulletin boards and to help keep things easy for neighbors to read.
- One Week at a Time: Ads are posted for one week, from Thursday to Thursday. If you'd like your ad to continue, you'll need to re-submit it each week-whether online or at the Front Desk.
- Two Ads Max Per Week: Each unit may submit up to two notices per week
- **No Commercial Soliciting:** Ads must be personal in nature—no retail, business promotion, or resale items are allowed (though on-site babysitting, pet sitting, and tutoring services are welcome).

All submissions will be reviewed by Management to ensure they meet the requirements outlined in Policy Resolution #33: Owner Communication, available on Building Link or at the Front Desk.




