MANAGER'S CORNER

MAINTAINING MOMENTUM AND BALANCE

We are moving into the fourth quarter of 2022, and as usual, the Rotonda is a hub of activity. The Management Staff is busy with maintenance and replacement projects. The committees are busy with scheduled activities. The Board of Directors is busy completing its work schedule for the year.



This issue of the Rostrum is full of details about these activities. I also want to offer thoughts about a process the Board of Directors has undertaken this year, meeting with its professional advisors, and about one its most important duties, which is "to prepare an annual budget for 2023, in which there shall be established the assessments of each Unit Owner for the Common Expenses".

What about the Annual Budget for 2023?

The assessments for 2023 will increase 2.4% over the level for 2022. Maintaining this level of assessments was difficult in the current climate of high inflation, which is at or about 8%.

What was working to increase costs? Sprint canceled its antenna contract, one of the sources of additional income. Utility costs are rising. The fuel component of the electricity bill is at an all-time high. Fairfax County increased Water and Sewer rates. Natural Gas prices have also skyrocketed. Contractors have increased their prices and/or added fuel cost riders. The contribution to the Replacement Reserve Fund is increased again in 2023. Most importantly, the cost of recruiting and keeping staff is harder and harder in the current labor market. The minimum wage in Virginia will rise again in 2023, and it is already higher in neighboring jurisdictions. A significant increase in the budget for payroll was required in the 2023 budget.

How did we avoid an even larger increase in assessments? We successfully negotiated contracts on a multi-year basis that have avoided sudden large increases. The elimination of the shuttle bus allowed for an almost 1.5% lower increase. We negotiated a Natural Gas purchase in 2021, covering three years starting in 2022, at a rate much lower than the current market rate. Staff salaries have long been supplemented by employment benefits that make the Rotonda an attractive employer. The Replacement Reserve plan maintains an aggressive program of component replacement and benefits from the work already invested over past years to move those projects forward.

While a 2.4% increase is a tough price to pay in increased assessments, it is a modest amount reflecting the philosophy that costs will always increase. A small annual increase each year helps obviate the need for dramatic large periodic increases. We will distribute a copy of the 2023 Approved Budget later this month.

The Board and Management do not work in a vacuum. A group of Professional advisors provide advice, information, and guidance as they perform their duties. At Board Meetings this year, the Board met with the following professionals:

- The Association Auditor, John Deane, of the firm Johnson, Bremer & Ignatio, CPA's, P.C. Each year the firm conducts a Certified Audit of the Association's finances.
- The Insurance Broker, Tom Danaher, President, Danaher Skewes & Associates. The Master Insurance program is an essential element of the Risk Management program for the Rotonda.
- A Licensed Engineer, Michael Violette, P.E., RRC, Violette Engineering, LLC. He prepared a Structural evaluation of the property as well as the contract documents for the recent Concrete and Paving work.
- Fire Protection Engineers, Matthew Lausch, PE, and Garrett Wack, of Jensen Hughes, Inc.- They will be preparing a design and contract documents for replacement of the Fire Alarm system in Building III.
- Investment Advisor, Theodore Hart, Portfolio Management Director, Morgan Stanley Wealth Management Group.

Together with these professionals and hand-in-hand with the Rotonda Management and Staff, the Board performs the duties necessary for the administration of the affairs of the Unit Owners Association.

RCUOA ANNUAL MEETING

SET FOR TUESDAY, DECEMBER 6TH

This year's Annual Owners' Meeting will take place on Tuesday, December 6th, 2022 at 7pm via Zoom. There will be, however, an option of participating in person in the Community Center, where there will be a projector screen set up as well as a few socially distanced seats for owners who do not have access to a Zoom link.

The Notice of the Annual Meeting will be mailed in early November to on site and offsite owners and will include information on candidates, electronic voting information, and paper ballots for voting in person. Information about voting and the Annual Meeting will be also advertised on the Bulletin Boards. We had excellent results using the Zoom option last year and had a much larger attendance than we had in previous years.

For those new to the Rotonda community, the Annual Owners' Meeting is held in accordance with Article II, Section 2, of the Association Bylaws and includes several separate events. The main event is the election of members to the Board of Directors, but the meeting will also include an address by the Board President on the "State of the Rotonda."

RCUOA ANNUAL MEETING CONT.

This year, the election will be for three Director seats with 3-year terms expiring in December 2025. A Nomination Petition for Candidates has been distributed to all unit owners, and the deadline to submit your nominations is November 6th. Nomination documents must be sent via email to secretary@rotonda.org or dropped off at the front desk in the Community Center no later than 11:59 PM on Sunday, November 6th, 2022 (if sent via email, please include the subject line: Attention: 2021 Election).

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AN UPDATE ON PROJECTS AROUND THE PROPERTY

1. Carpet Replacement & Lobby Flooring

As of the first week of October, the carpet installation in Buildings I, II, and V are complete, and contractors have begun installing carpet in Building III. The long-awaited travertine tile work also began the same week in the Building V lobby. We expect the lobby carpets in all of the other buildings to be removed as soon as possible, so the tile work can proceed quickly.



2. Concrete Repairs

In mid-September, the sidewalks, curbs, and circles in front of every Building as well as the main entrance of the Community Center underwent concrete repairs.

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3. Milling & Paving Repair

In mid-September, the large portions of the parking lots under-went milling and paving repairs to fix cracks and other pavement deterioration.

RECYCLING 101 SERIES


PART 3 - Hazardous Waste Disposal

Hazardous waste includes items such as automotive fluids, motor oil, car batteries, oil-based paint and paint thinners, wood stains and varnish, preservatives, poisons, and the like. A complete list can be found at <https://www.fairfaxcounty.gov/publicworks/recycling-trash/household-hazardous-waste>.



Disposal of such items is free to Fairfax County residents. See the web site for locations and times. However, if you have unused latex paint, there is an easy and safe way to dispose of it in the trash:

- Divide the paint into small amounts, 1/3-full can or less;
- Add kitty litter, sand or shredded newspaper into the liquid latex paint and mix well;
- Leave the lid off, set aside and allow the paint to completely dry;
- Dispose of the can with the dried paint in the trash.

Even easier, if you have only a small amount of latex paint, just brush it on cardboard pieces, let them dry, and then put them in the trash. Let the can sit with the top off until the residue dries and then dispose of the can in the trash (having put the top back on).



There is a 24-hour charging station for electric vehicles located in the Community Center Parking Lot.



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ROTONDA'S LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE AT WORK AROUND THE PROPERTY



Have you seen the beautiful arrangement of plants and rocks by the International Gate? McFall & Berry and Facilities Director Guy Sturms worked hard to create this award-winning design with shaded landscaped benches for residents to come and enjoy, meet their neighbors, bring their dog, or greet for the school bus.

This area has evolved into an important location for parents and guardians to gather and wait for their young ones to arrive home from school. There is stair access from Behind Building I that leads directly up to the benches and circle where the school bus stops.



GET TO KNOW ROTONDA'S TREES

You may have seen these beautiful trees with bright purple, pink, and white flowers around the property.

The crape myrtle is a deciduous, small to medium sized shrub or small tree with a variable, moderately dense foliage, and is often multi-stemmed.

The showy pink flowers have wrinkled petals like crepe paper. The foliage is dark green changing in fall to yellows, oranges, and reds.

The thin gray bark is exfoliating (peeling off), exposing a smooth, variable-colored under bark ranging from brown to gray.





4. Fairfax Water Valve Project Restoration

What was all that digging in front of buildings III, IV, and V in early September? Why did the water have to be turned off to the whole building? Fairfax Water chose this time to come on the property and perform maintenance on the main water valves serving those three buildings. Those valves are five feet underground and can only be accessed for maintenance by digging holes in the parking lot.



5. Mandatory Fire Alarm Testing

In late October, contractors will inspect the fire alarms in each unit per Fairfax Fire code, which requires that the inspectors confirm that every device, including the speakers in your unit are operating. Our contractor, Mona Electrical (Fire Division) will access ALL units per the below schedule beginning at 10:00 a.m. to approximately 12:00 noon. This inspection will be very quick, as only the contractor is expected to enter your unit and only as far as the speaker location. Questions? Call the Front Desk at 703-821-0100.

What You Need To Do:

1. Review the Inspection Schedule for your Building. Be Prepared!
2. Be near your door at 10:00 a.m. for contractors to verify speaker operation. The building alarm will be sounding until the inspection is completed for all floors.
3. If you do not open your door or are not home, a Security Escort will unlock your unit with the Emergency Key on file to provide the contractor access to the speaker location. Only the contractor will enter your unit.

** If inspectors cannot gain access to a Unit, a repeat inspection will be performed, possibly at the expense of the resident(s). Repeat inspection dates will be announced for the entire building as frequently as needed until 100% completion.


